Jazz Camps, and was the 2011 Guest Clinician at the Trad. Jazz Youth Band Fest.



JASON WANNER — Jason was an STJS Music Lesson Award recipient and played piano for TNT, the STJS-sponsored youth band. Amazingly, he went from student to instructor at the STJS Trad. Jazz Camps. In 2010, Jason was Guest Clinician at the Trad. Jazz Youth Band Festival (TJYBF). For many years, he has performed trad jazz with the Blue Street Jazz Band. In addition, Jason is an accomplished classical pianist.

The **AU BROTHERS** — an entire family of musicians has benefitted from STJS Jazz Ed. programs. **Gordon Au** is a professional trumpeter in New York, and a graduate of the Monk Institute in New Orleans. **Brandon Au** (*trombone, tuba*) performs in the Sacramento area and works with local schools to develop their traditional jazz programs. **Justin Au** (*trumpet*) has made guest appearances with trad bands on the festival circuit, and plays regularly with the RedSkunks.
