# Dec. 11: Raise the roof with Tom Rigney & Flambeau

We had such a super-charged good time last December with Tom Rigney & Flambeau that we decided to do it again! Music lovers can't get enough of this band, and they can be found performing at festivals, on cruise ships, and here at Jazz Sunday.

After fifteen years as the leader and electrifying violinist of The Sundogs, fiddler/composer **Tom Rigney** stepped out on his own with a hot new band that merged some of the finest musicians on the San Francisco roots music scene,

energizing and raising the spirits of every crowd they play for.

The band, **Flambeau**, has become exceedingly popular across the country because they appeal to a wide audience and can tear the roof off any place that has one. The repertoire is original, eclectic, passionate, and filled with a musical and emotional intensity.

Fellow members: No, the City of Sacramento has not taken over our major fundraiser, the Sacramento Music Festival. We do have a valuable relationship with many divisions of the City. Since day one, they have been—and will continue to be—our strong supporters and partners.

While the festival offers a variety of music styles (primarily jazz), STJS as an organization is committed to its mission of promoting and preserving traditional jazz through: 1) Trad. Jazz Camps in the summer; 2) the Trad. Jazz Youth **Band Festival** in Feb.; 3) **TNT**—The New Traditionalists, our STJS-sponsored youth band; 4) annual Music Lesson Awards to pay for traditional

jazz education by private instructors; 5) traditional jazz **mentoring** (for musicians of all ages) in the Tailgate Room at the monthly Jazz Sunday events; and 6) presentation of outstanding guest artists, plus numerous traditional jazz and swing bands in 3 different rooms, from noon to 5pm, at the monthly Jazz Sunday events. Our recent guest, **Doug** Finke, spoke to our Main Stage audience with high praise for STJS and the great thing we have going here for jazz.

I am always encouraging our members to attend our monthly board meetings. Even if you were to attend only a few meetings per year, it is an excellent way to participate, stay informed, and learn about all STJS activities firsthand—from jazz education to festival planning.

Our office is a hub of activity these days. All of the pre-planning for our major event occurs during the last quarter of each year, on into the spring. In the midst of all the activity, we managed to move out of our old warehouse and into a smaller, much more economical location. We cannot bring all the bands you wish to see every year, but many of your favorites will be there.


We are working with a company called "EventBrite" www. eventbrite.com for online ticketing as we are now in the 21st century. This company provides us the ability to purchase tickets online, then send them to your e-mail. You can print the tickets at home and take them to one of our six Admission Sales locations to exchange for a badge or wrist band. They also give us the capability to use social media to publicize our event—a great addition to our modernization effort.

You may have also noticed last month that the Early Bird Discount tickets are on sale. The All-Events badge for members is still only \$85. You cannot beat seeing four days of great music for this unbelievable price. (But wait there's more...) Early purchase enters you into a prize drawing to win four days in a luxury suite at the Holiday Inn, plus \$100 in festival food and beverage tickets. 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# **Dante Club Notes**

All Hail Bob Ringwald! Our Emperor showered largesse on his loyal subjects by making October Jazz Sunday ALL TRAD on the Main Stage! It was glorious. Bob Schulz came over from the Bay Area to join our guest artist, the superb trombonist Doug Finke, on both of his Main Stage sets. They also dropped in on sets in both the Gold Card Room and the Tailgate Room. They had almost as much fun as we did—almost. Doug and Jay Paulus are graduates of the same high school back in Illinois, so there was some two-trombone stuff thrown in for good measure. Jim Fusaro, also a graduate of said high school, was at the Medford Jazz Festival—formerly Medford Jazz Jubilee. (Hmmm...do you see a trend here?) The Finke/Schulz pair were joined by Dutch Deutsch and Charlie Hull on reeds; John Cocuzzi and Bob Ringwald on piano; Lenny Pollacchi and Darrell Fernandez on bass; and Gene Copelan and Vince Bartels on drums—not all at once, though!

Ira Greenstein, Norm Gary, Bill Au, Pat Blucher, Dave Sieber and Susan Phillips started on the right foot with a nice danceable first set, and Charlie Gehlbach, Bob Noren, Gary Reynolds, Bill Dickson, Mickey Bennett and Bruce Turley kept up the temperature on Set 3.

Actually, the first music of the day came from the auditions in the Gold Card Room. Paula Dula kept the applicants on track, and her judicial council approved several candidates for receipt of Gold Cards. (See full report elsewhere.) Dick Lockwood, Jim Roberson, Alan Ginter, Bob Ringwald, Jay Paulus and Charlie Gehlbach were the "performing" judges. Charlie, Jay and Dick were then joined by Dave Chan, Jack Scott, Jimmy Spero and Eddi Benjamini for GCR Set 1—along with Finke and Schulz!

Bryce Korte auditioned, then joined Ken Champion, Jack Mootz, Mark Kramer, Scotty Harper and Tony Bellacera on a hot Set 2. GCR Set 4 was Lee Monthei, Howard Pearson, Gene Mondro/Lockwood, Billie Menz, Mike Melnikof, Dan Lobay, Ned Poffinbarger—along with Finke and Schulz! And Paulus. "Iron Lips" Awards to all of you!

Ken Meyers, Hull, Ginter and Roberson were the Vocal Set band. Paula picks the musicians for the vocal set very carefully—they have to be especially versatile. For instance, they really got behind Claude Purcell on a stompin' "House of Blue Lights," and then cradled T Jackson on "Long Ago and Far Away." Pat Kennedy called Paula two months ago to reserve "Autumn Leaves" for this month, and Wally Hawkins' "Up a Lazy River" was just wild! Charlie Hull called Melissa Collard "the compleat musician" after "I Don't Want to Set the World on Fire." All told, there were 17 vocalists. Desert Dan Whitney listened to every one; seemed a little awestruck. His opinion: it takes guts to get up there with just a microphone between you and the audience. He usually has a guitar.

Speaking of **T Jackson**, she was returning after an absence of several months—and so was her husband, **Martin**, clearly recovering well after brain surgery! Welcome back! **Kathy Becker**, on the other hand—for Pete's sake, Girl, have some sense!—she had a HEART ATTACK the week before Jazz Sunday, had a stent installed, and showed up to sell raffle tickets! He said it's healing okay. **Bill McMartin**, one of our more enthusiastic dancers, said the dressing on his cheek was the aftermath of skin cancer removal. Ouch! 


















(cont. from pg. 1) and of course, those notorious red boots. His bandmates are veterans of the great bands of Charles Brown, Queen Ida, Roy Rogers, Clifton Chenier, and others. Together they generate enough heat and energy to ignite a dance floor or lift an audience to its feet.

Flambeau specializes in fiery Cajun and zydeco two-steps, low-down blues, funky New Orleans grooves, and heartbreakingly beautiful ballads and waltzes. Most of the repertoire is composed by Rigney, but they also mix in a few classics from the Cajun/zydeco/New Orleans songbook. Along the way, if you pick up a trace of Rigney's Irish roots or a little Swing and roots Rock and Roll, it just makes the musical gumbo that much tastier. Rigney makes audiences feel that they are an integral part of the music and the show.

Voted Best Cajun/Zydeco Band of 2004 by the West Coast Blues Hall of Fame, Tom Rigney & Flambeau are making some serious noise on the American roots music scene. Flambeau has been tearing things up at festivals, dances, and concerts all over the continent—from the Ft. Lauderdale Cajun Crawfish Festival to the Edmonton Blues Festival to the Alaska State Fair.

Tom Rigney has been a part of the San Francisco Bay Area roots music scene for over twenty-five years. The son of baseball great, Bill Rigney, Tom is a native of the Bay Area. His musical career began after he finished his graduate studies at Harvard University, where he received a masters degree in Fine Arts. Tom first rose to prominence as the leader/fiddler of the legendary Bluegrass/Western Swing band, Back in the Saddle. He won a Bammie award in 1981 for the band's debut recording. He also wrote their hit song, "Time and Again," which rode the country music charts in the Bay Area for weeks.

Tom joined Queen Ida's Bon Temps Zydeco Band and toured the world in 1983 and 1984. He developed a love of South Louisiana dance music. Cajun, zydeco, and New Orleans second line grooves formed a major ingredient in the sound of his next band, The Sundogs. Teaming with songwriter Joe Paquin and slide guitarist T.J. Politzer, Tom and The Sundogs performed and recorded together for fifteen years, touring extensively across the U.S., Canada, and Europe, performing a scorching blend of Cajun, blues, and roots Rock and Roll.

The strong Cajun/zydeco influence is still present, as are the irresistible dance grooves, but there is a deepening of the emotional range, and a concentration on creating moving and memorable melodies. He has literally become a "singer" on the violin. Join us on Dec. 11 for music that bursts with the energy of the bayou one minute, turns passionate with gypsy jazz the next, raises the roof with a Celtic reel and then touches the heart with a beautiful waltz. What a nice holiday gift!

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
